Teaching and Learning	SVPCET adopts a student centric approach to achieve the desired learning outcomes. Interactive learning techniques like seminars, tutorials, video lectures and programming contests, major and mini projects enrich the teaching learning experience. Besides JNTUA prescribed syllabus, special coaching is given on communication skills and aptitude to prepare the students for employment. Teachers prepare Course Files that include lesson plans, lecture notes, teaching methodology, objectives and outcomes. Several modes of feedback mechanisms make sure that the teaching learning and evaluation processes are conducted to the satisfaction of stakeholders The academic programmes are supported by 209 faculty members. The college maintains a faculty student ratio of 1:15 in Undergraduate programme and 1:12 in masters programmes. The context: The institute has been working with the aim of making it a centre of excellence. Students from different levels backgrounds need training to improve their technical as well as organizational skills. Considering these requirements, college is providing excellent facilities for the students to improve their skills and to achieve their career goals. The Practice: a. Students under the guidance of faculty members organise departmental associations in each department.
